(In a Vaudeville style)

(Hands TOM a hat)

'Lil' Lolly

Uh, huh!

Let's go!

(THEY place hats on their heads)

ALL

ONE, TWO!

LOLLY, LOLLY, LOLLY, GET YOUR ADVERBS HERE.  
LOLLY, LOLLY, LOLLY, GOT SOME ADVERBS HERE.  
COME ON DOWN TO LOLLY'S, GET THE ADVERBS HERE  
YOU'RE GOING TO NEED IF YOU WRITE  
OR READ OR EVEN THINK ABOUT IT.

LOLLY, LOLLY, LOLLY, GET YOUR ADVERBS HERE.

GOT A LOT OF LOLLY JOLLY ADVERBS HERE.  
ANYTHING YOU NEED

HOW, WHERE OR WHEN,

WHEN YOU USE AN ADVERB.

boxes, cans, etc. that have the word "ADVERBS" painted on them)
